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This event aims to bring experience on previous Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs) in the public health domain to explore their role in the genomic context, thus analysing **how to promote the establishment of European PPPs in genomics**. The increased adoption of large scale projects based on sequencing population data may increasingly coexist with commercial entities. These projects are associated with high level of investment to include: major scientific equipment; knowledge-based resources such as collections, archives or scientific data; e-infrastructures that would be able to benefit public and private institutions. Nonetheless, these projects also raise ethical, legal and social questions.
